Nichols, Ronald H. (editor), with Bird, Daniel I., **Men With Custer: Biographies of the 7th Cavalry.** This book is a reference source containing the biographies of the officers, enlisted men, citizens, Indian scouts and quartermaster employees who were associated with the 7th United States Cavalry Regiment in June 1876. The Little Big Horn battle continues to be one of controversy, and while it certainly was a significant battle in terms of military history of the western United States during the 1865 to 1890 time period, its overall affect on U.S. history was minor. But what of the men who were in the 7th Cavalry on that fateful day on June 25, 1876? Where were they born? What were their civilian jobs? How long were they in the army? What were their assignments on June 25? What was their ultimate fate? This is a new and expanded edition of *Men With Custer: Biographies of the 7th Cavalry* published by CBHMA in 2000. This expanded edition contains over 500 pages.

Nichols, Ronald H. (editor), **Reno Court of Inquiry: Proceedings of a Court of Inquiry in the Case of Major Marcus A. Reno.** In 1876 the United States was shocked at the news of the loss of over 260 officers and men at the Little Big Horn. There was an almost immediate attempt to establish blame for the disaster. Brig. Gen. Alfred H. Terry, in command of the Dakota column, managed to escape direct accusations, thus focusing attention on Maj. Marcus A. Reno, Custer's second-in-command, and Capt. Frederick W. Benteen, the senior captain. Frederick Whittaker's book *The Complete Life of Major General George Armstrong Custer*, published in late 1876, accused Reno and Benteen of cowardly conduct. A Court of Inquiry was convened at the Palmer House in Chicago, Illinois, on January 13, 1879, to determine the facts of the case and 23 witnesses testified over a four week period. This is the only official testimony about the events of June 25-26, 1876, and was taken directly from the original transcript at the National Archives. This is a biography of Dewey Beard, a Lakota who witnessed the Battle of Little Bighorn and survived the Wounded Knee Massacre. Not only did he witness two major battles against the Lakota, he traveled with William "Buffalo Bill" Cody's Wild West show, worked as a Hollywood Indian, and witnessed the transformation of the Black Hills into a tourism center. Dewey Beard spent most of his later life fighting to reclaim his homeland. Burham presents the man behind the legend of Dewey Beard, the last survivor of the Little Bighorn.
