


The Little Big Horn battle continues to be one of controversy, and while it certainly was a significant battle in terms of military history of the western United States during the 1865 to 1890 time period, its overall affect on U.S. history was minor. But what of the men who were in the 7th Cavalry on that fateful day on June 25, 1876? Where were they born? What were their civilian jobs? How long were they in the army? What were their assignments on June 25? What was their ultimate fate? This is a new and expanded edition of *Men With Custer: Biographies of the 7th Cavalry* published by CBHMA in 2000. Agonito, Joseph, Brave Hearts: Indian Women of the Plains. Agonito Magid, Paul, The Gray Fox: George Crook and the Indian Wars. This skillfully conveys the lives of this remarkable group of women; some famous, some obscure. Some were hunters, some were warriors and, in a rare case, one was a chief. Some were born into traditional families and knew their place in society; others were bi-racial struggling to find their place in a world conflicted between Indian and white. Some only knew the old, nomadic way of life; others lived to suffer through the reservation years. Others were born on the reservation but did their best in difficult times to keep to the old ways. Some never left the reservation while others ventured out into the larger world. All, in their own way, were Plains Indian women. (No.1042) .....\$22.00

DeWolf, James Madison; Editor Harburn, Todd E; Foreword Hutton, Paul A., A Surgeon with Custer at the Little Big Horn. James Madison DeWolf accepted the assignment of contract surgeon for the Seventh Cavalry in the spring of 1876, becoming one of three surgeons who accompanied Custer's battalion at the Battle of the Little Big Horn. He died in the early stages of the battle, but his colleague Dr. Henry Porter, who survived the conflict, retrieved DeWolf's diary and sent it to his wife. The DeWolf family later donated the diary to the Little Bighorn National Monument. The diary represents an eyewitness account and primary resource for information about the Little Big Horn campaign and medical practices on the western frontier. Hardcover (No.1046) ..

Upon his return he was swept up in the traditional Ghost Dance movement and shaken by the Massacre at Wounded Knee. 
