

Call For Papers 2020 Symposium

On Friday, June 26, 2020, CBHMA will host its 34th Annual Symposium moderated by Vincent Heier.

Historical research papers will be presented that relate to the Little Big Horn battle, its participants or events immediately prior to or following the battle.

All proposals must include title of the paper and a synopsis of the non-fiction subject (not to exceed 250 words) and be submitted by **January 15, 2020** to be considered.

Up to five papers will be selected for presentation and those authors will be notified by **February 15, 2020**.

For papers selected, the authors will prepare: 1) a manuscript (typed, double-spaced, 3,500 words maximum, properly foot- or end-noted), 2) a CD or DVD containing a text file of the paper (preferred text MS Word) and a separate file containing photos and images, and 3) a short (250 word maximum) biography. Photos and images should not be embedded in the text. These items will be given to Dale Ramsey on the day of the symposium, along with the author signing a release form (provided by CBHMA) on the day of the symposium. (The release allows the Association to a one-time authorization to publish the paper in its annual symposium book.)

The author will present the paper at the Symposium (a designee will only be accepted in case of a last minute emergency) in Hardin, Montana. Following the presentation, the papers will be edited and published in a single volume, copies of which may be purchased for a nominal fee. The author will receive a free copy of the symposium book following publication.

During the past 33 years many excellent papers have been presented, but by no means have all subjects concerning this controversial battle or life of Custer been covered. If you have an avid interest in these events, you are encouraged to choose a subject, do a little research and write a paper. The process is not difficult and it may provide an opportunity to express your viewpoint or opinion on an important aspect of the battle.
